BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON, WARREN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY WASHINGTON BOROUGH COUNCIL MINUTES – August 21, 2007

The Regular Meeting of the Borough Council of Washington, Warren County, New Jersey was held in the Council Chambers of Borough Hall at 8:00 P.M.

Mayor Van Deursen led everyone in the flag salute.

Mayor Van Deursen read the following Statement into the Record:

"The requirements of the 'Open Public Meetings Law, 1975, Chapter 231 have been satisfied in that adequate notice of this meeting has been published in the Star Gazette and posted on the Bulletin Board of Borough Hall stating the time, place and purpose of the meeting as required by law.

COUNCIL APPEARANCE

<u>Robert Miller – Borough Engineer</u>

Robert Miller reviewed the Department of Transportation grant applications with the Council. Two of the grants are Safe Streets to School the others are Municipal Aid grant applications. The Safe Streets to School grants include Taylor Street sidewalk and curbing and McDonald Street sidewalk and curbing. The Municipal Aid grants include Belvidere Avenue Section II roadway reconstruction and curbing and sidewalks, Grand Avenue roadway reconstruction, North Lincoln Avenue Sections I, II, and III (three separate grant applications for roadway reconstruction), and South Lincoln Avenue resurfacing and sidewalk repair.

Mr. Miller asked Council to prioritize the grant submissions for the Department of Transportation. Council agreed to the following: Safe Streets to School – Taylor Street priority 1, McDonald Street priority 2. Municipal Aid – Belvidere Avenue Section II priority 1, Grand Avenue priority 2, North Lincoln Avenue Section III priority 3, North Lincoln Avenue Section II priority 4, North Lincoln Avenue Section I priority, and South Lincoln Avenue priority 6.

Councilman Turner inquired when the bid submissions for the DPW garage were to be submitted. Mr. Miller indicated the bid opening for the garage is September 6, 2007.

Councilman Higgins indicated that the corner of Taylor Street and West Stewart Street is in bad shape right now after the most recent storm. He asked if this is something Council address that right away. Mayor Van Deursen stated Council should consider this later in the meeting.

Councilwoman Woykowski indicated that she wants Council to consider the Borough's drainage system when looking into road projects. Mr. Miller indicated that the Borough's drainage system is antiquated and undersized. He stated discussions have been held in regard to conducting a spring management study of the Shabbecong Creek that would be approved by the D.E.P. The drainage systems that lead to the Shabbecong are a separate issue and need to be addressed individually. The Borough needs to carefully consider the drainage system and make sure conditions do not worsen due to redevelopment.

Manager Corica stated he has had several conversations with residents this past week due to the flooding; one of the suggestions made was to see if the Army Corps. Of Engineer's to see if they would have any interest in helping the Borough, another option may be involving the County.

Councilman Higgins asked Mr. Miller if there were any grants available that would help pay for the storm damage. Mr. Miller indicated that he was not aware of any available funds from the State.

Council discussed with Mr. Miller the request from a downtown business owner to have heat coils installed in the sidewalk. The heating system for the sidewalk had been previously installed in the 1960's. Mr. Miller indicated that they were not aware of the system being in the sidewalk. The business owner has requested that the Borough replace this system.

Council agreed that the Borough will not pay for the sidewalk heating system.

<u>Dawn Higgins – Chairperson Recreation Commission</u>

Ms. Higgins briefed Council on the recent updates to the Recreation Commission. The DPW took care of the tree limb at the park after the terrible storm. The Recreation Commission now has two maintenance positions. The signs for the Borough Park have been located and will be installed by the DPW.

Ms. Higgins indicated that the Recreation Commission has hired T & M Associates to analyze the pool project and conduct a feasibility study. Bids were received for the pool project and the Recreation Commission has made a recommendation to the Governing Body. The Resolution to award the Pool Project is before Council this evening. Mayor Van Deursen commended the Recreation Commission on taking their consultants advice and on having a very successful bidding process.

Councilman Turner asked Ms. Higgins if the fence would be in the same area or would be moved. Ms. Higgins stated that the pump house will be included in the fenced area and that would be the only change.

Councilwoman Woykowski echoed the Mayor's sentiments.

Mayor Van Deursen entertained a motion to move Resolution 210-2007. Resolution 210-2007 was moved by Councilman Housel, seconded by Councilwoman Woykowski and adopted.

RESOLUTION # 210-2007 A RESOLUTION TO AWARD A CONTRACT FOR POOL IMPROVEMENTS TO CFM CONSTRUCTION

WHEREAS, bids were advertised and were publicly opened and read on 2 August 2007 for Swimming Pool Renovations; including a base bid and four alternates; and

WHEREAS, 5 bids were submitted and reviewed by T & M Associates, consulting engineers; and

WHEREAS, T&M Associates has determined that the lowest responsible bidder for the base bid and all four alternates is CFM Construction of Stirling, New Jersey in the amount of \$348,000. said report is attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, T&M Associates, the Borough Manager and the Washington Borough Recreation Commission have recommended that a contract be awarded to CFM Construction for the base bid and the four alternates; said recommendation of the Recreation Commission is attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, a certification of funds by the Chief Financial Officer is attached.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Washington, in the County of Warren, State of New Jersey that it is in the best interest of the Borough to award a contract for the base bid and four alternates for the Swimming Pool Renovations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a contract is hereby awarded to CFM Construction, Stirling, New Jersey for the base bid and four alternates in accordance with CFM Constructions bid dated 2 August 2007, in the amount of \$348,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mayor, Borough Clerk and Borough Manager are hereby authorized to execute all necessary contracts and documents to award said contract.

Mayor Van Deursen entertained remarks from the audience on items that were not on the agenda.

Nicole Tiger Kid Care 70/72 East Washington Avenue

Ms. Tiger explained to Council that the installation of the new sidewalk in front of the day care center has caused flooding in the basement. The sidewalk seems to be sloped towards the front door of the daycare. Ms. Tiger stated that the Borough Manager did come and take a look at the situation.

Mayor Van Deursen asked for an update from the Manager. Manager Corica stated that there is an obvious problem that exists. Mr. Miller's recommendation is to have the seal fixed between the sidewalk and the apron. He stated he is not sure if it will totally solve the issue however the sidewalk does have a slight slope. If the seal does not work the Borough will have to look at other alternatives.

<u>Paul Terrik – 72 Lenape Trail</u>

Mr. Terrik inquired as to the status of his application to the Governing Body to install a fence on his property which includes a sewer easement. He also asked as to the status of the trees installed on his property that need to be replaced. Manager Corica stated that the Chairperson of the Shade Tree Commission was directed to review the trees and report back to the Borough Manager as to their health. As far as the fence; the Borough has put together all of the necessary information and forwarded that information to legal counsel. Manager Corica stated that the fence could be allowed to be placed on his property however; the Borough will retain the right to remove the fence to access the sewer easement if there is an emergency.

Mayor Van Deursen asked Council if they are in agreement to allow Mr. Terrik to place a fence on his property as long as he agrees to grant the Borough access to his property. Councilman Housel requested to see the plan of where the fence is going to be placed on the property. Mayor Van Deursen asked the Manager to have this prepared for the next meeting.

Mayor Van Deursen also requested the Manager set up a meeting with the Shade Tree Commission Chairperson and Mr. Terrik to try and come to some conclusion about the trees.

RJ Sherman – 15 Gardeners Court

Mr. Sherman stated he wanted to advise Council that the sewer did back up again into his basement during the last storm. He stated he is aware that the Council is working towards a resolution. He also stated that he understands that it was a horrific storm and a very exceptional one. He asked Council for a status on the resolution of this problem.

Manager Corica indicated that the report from H2M should be forwarded to Council very soon. Councilman Housel suggested pointing the sewer line the other way towards South Prospect. This needs to be checked with H2M when they present their report to Council.

Councilwoman Woykowski stated that the Council is also appropriating the money this evening to take care of this problem.

Mayor Van Deursen thanked Mr. Sherman for his testimony and for his patience as Council works towards a solution.

She stated she is in support of the adoption of this Ordinance however when this plan came before the Planning Board she specifically remembers stating that the plan needs to include decks. She stated that she warned the Planning Board that we can not have the same mistakes made as we did in the past where the plans did not include decks. She also stated that this is a wonderful development for the town.

Mr. Cohen stated that this oversight was not an intentional error on the part of Toll Brothers.

Hearing no further comments from the public Councilman Housel motioned to close the public hearing seconded by Councilman Cioni.

ORDINANCE #8-2007

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 94 OF THE WASHINGTON BOROUGH ORDINANCE ENTITLED "BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS ORDINANCE", AND MORE PARTICULARLY AMENDING THE BOROUGH'S DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS ORDINANCE, SECTION 94-79.1, ENTITLED "AR-7 AGE RESTRICTED RESIDENTIAL ZONE DISTRICT"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON, IN THE COUNTY OF WARREN, NEW JERSEY, that Chapter 94 of the Borough Ordinance entitled "Borough of Washington Development Regulations Ordinance," Section 94-79.1, known as the "AR-7 Age Restricted Residential Zone District," and more particularly Subsection 11(e) "Bulk Standards for Lotted Developments" "Rear Yard," is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION I

(E) Rear Yard. The minimum rear yard for any building shall be twelve (12) feet. The minimum rear yard for any deck attached to any building or any patio emanating from any building shall be four (4) feet.

SECTION II

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION III

If any article, section, subsection, paragraph, phrase or sentence is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, said article, section, subsection, paragraph, phrase or sentence shall be deemed severable.

SECTION IV

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 10-2007

BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON COUNTY OF WARREN STATE OF NEW JERSEY

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, REVISE AND SUPPLEMENT THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON, CHAPTER 3 "ADMINISTRATION OF GOVERNMENT, SECTION 3-52 "ENGINEERING DIVISION"

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Washington, Warren County, New Jersey, that Chapter 3 of the Code of the Borough of Washington, Warren County, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Chapter 3-52 "There shall be an Engineer appointed by the Manager for a term of three (3) years:...." shall be deleted and replace as follows:

"There shall be an Engineer appointed in accordance with statute;..."

The remainder of Chapter 3-52 shall remain unchanged.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its adoption and final publication in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE #11-2007

CAPITAL ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR IMPROVEMENTS OF THE SANITARY SEWERAGE SYSTEM IN, BY AND OF THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON, WARREN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$88,546 FROM THE SEWER CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON, IN THE COUNTY OF WARREN, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Borough of Washington (the "Borough"), Warren County, New Jersey is hereby authorized to make the following improvements in, by and for the Borough, including all work, materials, engineering, legal and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefore:

Repair and replacement of sewer mains within the Borough \$88,546

Section 2. The aggregate sum of \$88,546 is hereby appropriated from the Sewer Capital Improvement Fund of the Borough as payment of the cost for the authorized improvements described in Section 1 *supra*.

Section 3. The improvements described in Section 1, *supra* are hereby respectively authorized as general capital improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough having a period of usefulness of at least five (5) years

Section 4. The said purposes described in Section 1 of this ordinance are not current expenses and is an improvement which the Borough may lawfully make as general improvements, and no part of the costs thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

Section 5. Amounts not exceeding \$25,000 in the aggregate for engineering costs and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of the Local Bond Law may be included as part of the costs of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 6 The sewer capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this capital ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Borough Clerk and available for public inspection.

Section 7. This capital ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after final adoption, and publication as required by law.

CAPITAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON, WARREN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION AND IMPROVEMENTS TO REAL PROPERTY IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH AND APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$760,000 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON, IN THE COUNTY OF WARREN, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Borough of Washington (the "Borough"), Warren County, New Jersey is hereby authorized to make the following improvements and acquisitions in, by and for the Borough, including all work, materials, engineering, legal and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefore:

Acquisition and improvements to one or more parcels of Real Property \$760,000

- Section 2. The aggregate sum of \$760,000 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund of the Borough as payment of the cost for the improvements to, and acquisition of one or more parcels of real property authorized and described in Section 1 *supra*.
- Section 3. The improvements described in Section 1, *supra* are hereby respectively authorized as general capital improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough having a period of usefulness of at least five (5) years.
- Section 4. The said purposes described in Section 1 of this ordinance are not current expenses and each is a property or improvement which the Borough may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the costs thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

Section 5. Amounts not exceeding \$150,000 in the aggregate for engineering costs and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the costs of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 6 The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this capital ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Borough Clerk and available for public inspection.

Section 7. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after final adoption, and publication as required by law.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Special Shared Services Report: Borough Clerk, Kristine Blanchard reported to Council that the County of Warren has been awarded \$400,000.00 in PARIS funding to support those municipalities participating in records management. The \$400,000.00 will support the function of needs assessment, records inventory, and the strategic plan process for the participating municipalities in Warren County. There will be a kick-off meeting held on September 5, 2007 with the vendors who will be conducting the needs assessment and records inventories. More details of the process will be explained at that time. This is an extremely important step for the Borough to seriously take a look at space issues surrounding storage of records and also to consider plans for disaster recover in the event of a catastrophic event.
