The Regular Meeting of the Borough Council of Washington, Warren County, New Jersey was held in the Council Chambers of Borough Hall at 7:30 P.M.

Mayor McDonald led everyone in the flag salute.

Mayor McDonald read the following Statement into the Record:

Councilman Higgins noted one correction.

AUDIENCE

Ms. Penny Shaul - Recreation Questions

Ms. Shaul asked what the status was to the questions presented by Beth Uporsky at the last meeting. Manager Phelan stated that he met with both Ms. Uporsky and Mr. Masenior regarding the approval of opening the pool given by Council. Ms. Uporsky's questions were answered. Ms. Shaul requested clarification on the Recreation Department funds. Manager Phelan stated that Ms. Uporsky's request to allow recreation funds to be moved within sports programs was approved by Council as well. Trust fund monies are the only funds that will be moved to offset other sports programs. Manager Phelan stated that any money given to the Recreation Department can not be moved until the end of the year and only by resolution of the governing body. Manager Phelan stated that in 2009 Recreation had more money given to them for capital purchases that we decided against doing. The amount allocated that went back to Council was \$86,000. Ms. Shaul asked Manager Phelan if he would look back and see if any more transfers were done out of Recreation line items. Councilman Higgins explained that when they were a commission the town gave them a donation. Now that they are a department; they need to build the recreation trust account up. Manager Phelan will follow up with Ms. Shaul regarding any recreation transfers.

Joe Kresser - 92 Carlton Ave

Mr. Kresser asked if a person wanted to donate money to recreation how would they go about doing that. Manager Phelan stated that it would need to be specific on where the money was to go and what it was to be used for.

Joe Groff Washington Emergency Squad

Mr. Groff stated that the Emergency Squad will be holding their 75th Anniversary Parade next September. They will be using the same parade route that is used for the 4th of July celebration. Manager Phelan and Mr. Groff will work on the required paperwork.

Joe DePalma 14 State Street

Mr. DePalma stated that he has been over assessed and therefore over taxed on his property since 1997 due to an error made by the tax assessor. The property size listed on his property card in the Assessors office is completely wrong. Attorney Cushing explained the appeal process to Mr. DePalma. All assessments must by appealed by April 1. Mr. DePalma stated that someone did not do their job and I have been paying for it ever since 1997. Attorney Cushing stated that he will look into the statute further.

Chris Woykowski 24 South Prospect Street

Ms. Woykowski presented a letter to the Mayor and Council and a letter to the Borough Manager with more questions she would like answered.

Raj Rathod - Krauszers

Mr. stated that he has received fines from the town regarding the lighted signage used his business. Mayor McDonald stated that he has spoken with the manager regarding this situation and it is his understanding that because the business closed for a number of months, he is not able to use the previous signs. Manager Phelan stated that there is an appeal process. He can apply for a variance with the Board of Adjustment. Attorney Cushing stated that this governing body does not have authority to give you the permission you need to use the back lit sign. He stated that it is important that everyone is treated fairly and that Mr. will need to appeal the Board of Adjustment to overturn the Zoning Officer's decision.

Sewer Committee – Councilman Higgins reported that at the recent meeting they reviewed the Pleasant Valley Dam proposal. We need to do the phase 1 survey and the data compilation. We also need to complete phase 2 which is the hydraulic study. He stated we may not need to do phase 3. The sewer committee recommends the approval of phase 1 and phase 2 with not to exceed of \$21,000. This motion was made by Councilman Higgins, seconded by Councilwoman Gleba. – All yes.

Councilman Higgins stated they also discussed the age restrictions being lifted at the Jade Development project. Manager Phelan stated the Planning Board wants a letter from Council stating there is enough capacity. Councilman Higgins stated this was already included in the wastewater management plan; the committee recommends that we go ahead and allow it. Jade Development has also agreed to pay for any changes made to wastewater management plan. Councilman Higgins made a motion to inform the Planning Board that there is enough capacity and to have Jade Development pay for any changes to the wastewater management plan, seconded by Valentine. Housel, Valentine, McDonald, Higgins – yes, Gleba – Abstain. Motion Carried.

Councilman Higgins also reported that there is a Quick Chek going in at the old Washington Township Municipal Building. The same developer is also putting in a bank right next to Quick Chek in the Borough. They are requesting that the Quick Chek be allowed to hook in the Borough sewer system due to the fact that the bank will need to hook in because they will be located in the Borough. The developer is willing to pay for anything upgrades, etc. The Borough Engineer is suggested giving the developer preliminary approval as they will need to go before all the respective boards before final approval anyway.

Councilman Higgins made a motion to give the developer preliminary approval, there was not second.

Councilman Higgins made a motion to deny the request for preliminary approval, seconded by Housel – All yes

She proposed the following reductions: \$17, 424 in parks and recreation salary, \$6,291 from the operating budget, and remove the appropriation from the current fund for the grand illumination, Easter egg hunt, and the Fourth of July activities at the park.

Councilwoman Gleba motioned to have these reductions placed in the recreation budget, seconded by Councilman Housel for discussion.

Councilman Housel asked if these reductions have been discussed with Mr. Masenior. Councilwoman Gleba stated she discussed the salary and wages but not the reduction to operating costs. Councilman Higgins stated he would like all of these reductions discussed with Mr. Masenior prior to Council approval. Councilman Housel withdrew his second on the Motion, Councilwoman Gleba withdrew her motion.

ORDINANCE 9-2010

Chapter A96, CABLE TELEVISION FRANCHISE

GENERAL REFERENCES

Streets and sidewalks -- See Ch. 75.

§ A96-1. Purpose.

The Borough hereby grants to Comcast of Northwest New Jersey, LLC., renewal of its nonexclusive municipal consent to place in, upon, across, above, over and under highways, streets, alleys, sidewalks, easements, public ways and public places in the Borough poles, wires, cables, underground conduits, manholes and other television conductors, fixtures, apparatus and equipment as may be necessary for the construction, operation and maintenance in the Borough of a cable television and communications system.

§ A96-2. Definitions.

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meaning given herein. Such meaning or definition of terms is supplemental to those definitions of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) rules and regulations, 47 C.F.R. Subsection 76.1 et seq., and the Cable Communications Policy Act, 47 U.S.C. Section 521 et seq., as amended, and the Cable Television Act, N.J.S.A. 48:5A-1 et seq., and shall in no way be construed to broaden, alter or conflict with the federal and state definitions:

ACT OR CABLE TELEVISION ACT -- Chapter 186 of the General Laws of New Jersey, and subsequent amendments thereto, N.J.S.A. 48:5A-1 et seq.

BASIC CABLE SERVICE -- Any service tier which includes the retransmission of local television broadcast signals as defined by the FCC.

BOARD OR BPU -- The Board of Public Utilities, State of New Jersey.

COMPANY -- The grantee of rights under this ordinance and is known as "Comcast of Northwest New Jersey, LLC."

FCC -- The Federal Communications Commission.

MUNICIPALITY OR BOROUGH -- The Borough of Washington, County of Warren, State of New Jersey.

OFFICE OR OCTV -- The Office of Cable Television of the Board.

§ A96-3. Statement of findings.

Public hearings conducted by the Borough concerning the renewal of municipal consent herein granted to the company were held after proper public notice pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Act and the regulations of the Board adopted pursuant thereto. Said hearings, having been fully open to the public, and the Borough, having received at said public hearings all comments regarding the qualifications of the

company to receive this renewal of municipal consent, the Borough hereby finds that the company possesses the necessary legal, technical, character, financial and other qualifications and that the company's operating and construction arrangements are adequate and feasible.

§ A96-4. Duration of franchise.

A.The nonexclusive municipal consent granted herein shall expire 15 years from the date of expiration of the previous certificate of approval issued by the Board.

B.In the event that the municipality shall find that the company has not substantially complied with the material terms and conditions of this ordinance, the municipality shall have the right to petition the OCTV for appropriate action, including modification and/or termination of the certificate of approval; provided, however, that the municipality shall first have given the company written notice of all alleged instances of noncompliance and an opportunity to cure same within 90 days of that notification.

§ A96-5. Franchise fee.

Pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Act, the company shall, during each year of operation under the consent granted herein, pay to the Borough 2% of the gross revenues from all recurring charges in the nature of subscription fees paid by subscribers for cable television reception service in the Borough or any higher amount required by the Act or otherwise allowable by law, whichever is greater.

§ A96-6. Franchise territory.

The consent granted under this ordinance to the renewal of the franchise shall apply to the entirety of the Borough and any property subsequently annexed hereto.

§ A96-7. Extension of service.

The Company shall be required to proffer service to any residence or business along any public right-of-way in the Primary Service Area, as set forth in the Company's Application. The Company's Line Extension Policy, as set forth in the Company's Application, shall govern any extension of plant beyond the Primary Service Area.

§ A96-8. Construction requirements.

A. Restoration. In the event that the company or its agents shall disturb any pavement, street surfaces, sidewalks, driveways, or other surface in the natural topography, the company shall, at its sole expense, restore and replace such places or things so disturbed in as good a condition as existed prior to the commencement of said work.

- B. Relocation. If at any time during the period of this consent the municipality shall alter or change the grade of any street, alley or other way or place, the company, upon reasonable notice by the municipality, shall remove, relay or relocate its equipment at the expense of the company.
- C. Temporary removal of cables. The company shall, upon request of the municipality at the company's expense, temporarily raise, lower, or remove its lines in order to facilitate the moving of buildings or machinery or in other like circumstances. Whenever the request is made by, for, or on behalf of private parties, the cost will be borne by those same parties.

D. Removal or trimming of trees. During the exercise of its rights and privileges under this franchise, the company shall have the authority to trim trees upon and overhanging streets, alleys, sidewalks or other public places of the municipality so as to prevent the branches of such trees from coming in contact with the wires and cable of the company. Such trimming shall be only to the extent necessary to maintain proper clearance of the company's wire and cables.

§ A96-9. Customer service.

In providing services to its customers, the company shall comply with N.J.A.C. 14:18-1 et seq. and all applicable state and federal statutes and regulations. The company shall strive to meet or exceed all voluntary company and industry standards in the delivery of customer service and shall be prepared to report on it to the community upon written request of the Borough Manager or Clerk.

- A. The company shall comply fully with all applicable state and federal statues and regulations regarding credits for outages, the reporting of same to regulatory agencies and notification of same to customers.
- B. The company shall comply fully with all applicable state and federal statues and regulations regarding the availability of devices for the hearing impaired and the notification of same to customers.
- C. The company shall use every effort to meet or exceed voluntary standards for telephone accessibility developed by the National Cable Television Association (NCTA). Those standards shall include, but not be limited to, the goal of answering 80% of incoming telephone calls within 30 seconds.
- D. Nothing herein shall impair the right of any subscriber or the municipality to express any comment with respect to telephone accessibility to the complaint officer or impair the right of the complaint officer to take any action that is appropriate under law.
- E. The company is permitted, but is not required to, charge a late fee consistent with applicable state and federal statutes and regulations.
- § A96-10. Municipal complaint officer.

The Office of Cable Television is hereby designated as the complaint officer for the municipality pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:5A-26b. All complaints shall be received and processed in accordance with N.J.A.C. 14:17-6.5. The municipality shall have the right to request copies of records and reports pertaining to complaints by Borough customers from the OCTV.

§ A96-11. Local office.

- A. During the term of this franchise, and any renewal thereof, the company shall maintain a local business office or agent for the purpose of receiving, investigating and resolving all complaints regarding the quality of service, equipment malfunctions and similar matters. Such local business office shall be open during normal business hours and in no event less than 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Telephone access and response for such purposes as mentioned herein will be provided by the company's employees, representatives or agents 24 hours per day.
- B. The telephone number and address of the local office shall be listed in applicable telephone directories and in correspondence from the company to the customer. The telephone number for the local office shall utilize an exchange that is a non-toll call for Borough residents.

§ A96-12. Performance bonds.

During the life of the franchise, the company shall give to the municipality a bond in the amount of \$25,000. Such bond shall be to insure the faithful performance of all undertakings of the company as represented in its application for municipal consent incorporated herein.

A96-13. Subscriber rates.

The rates of the company shall be subject to regulation as permitted by federal and state law.

§ A96-14. Public, educational and governmental access.

A. The company shall continue to provide residents with system-wide public access opportunities on a channel maintained by the company. Qualified individuals and organizations may utilize public access for the purpose of cablecasting noncommercial access programming in conformance with the company's published public access rules.

- B. The company shall continue to provide system-wide leased or commercial access channel opportunities on a channel maintained by the company for the purpose of cablecasting commercial access programming in conformance with the company's guideline and applicable state and federal statutes and regulations.
- C. The company shall take any steps that are necessary to ensure that the signals originated on the access channels are carried without material degradation, and with a signal whose quality is equal to that of the other channels that the company transmits.
- § A96-15. Commitments by company.
- A. Company representatives shall appear at least once annually, upon reasonable written request of the Borough, at a public hearing of the governing body or before the Borough's Cable Television Advisory Committee, to discuss matters pertaining to the provision of cable service to residents of the Borough and other related issues as the Borough and company may see fit.
- B. The company shall continue to provide a free standard cable installation with free basic service to each current and future elementary, middle, and secondary school classroom in the Borough provided the school is within 200 feet of active cable distribution plant. Each additional outlet installed, if any, shall be paid for on a materials and equipment, plus labor basis by the school requesting service. Monthly service charges shall be waived on all additional outlets.

The company shall provide one free non-networked internet connection and service via high-speed cable modem to the public library and all elementary, middle, and secondary school libraries and computer labs, connections are to be accessible for student use and cannot be restricted to administrative use. All facilities must be located within 200 feet of active cable distribution plant.

C. The company shall provide one free standard installation with free basic service to the Municipal Building and each Fire Department, First Aid Squad, Library, Special Improvement District (S.I. D.) main office and Public Works building, as well as any other municipal owned building that is located in or may be constructed within the Borough throughout the duration of this agreement, provided that each facility is located within 200 feet of active cable distribution plant. Each additional outlet installed, if any, shall be paid for on a materials and equipment, plus labor basis by the Municipality. Monthly service charges shall be waived on all additional outlets.

D. Within 12 months of the issuance of a Certificate of Approval (COA) by the Office of Cable Television, the company shall provide to the municipality a one-time grant of \$25,000 for access support.

§ A96-16. Emergency uses.

A. The company shall be required to fully comply with all applicable federal and state statutes and regulations rules and regulations governing the implementation, operation and testing of the emergency alert system (EAS).

B. The company shall in no way be held liable for any injury suffered by the municipality or any other person, during an emergency, if for any reason the municipality is unable to make full use of the cable television system as contemplated herein.

§ A96-17. Liability insurance.

The company shall at all times maintain a comprehensive general liability insurance policy with a single limit amount of \$1,000,000 covering liability for any death, personal injury, property damages or other liability arising out of its construction and operation of the cable television system and an excess liability (or "umbrella") policy in the amount of \$5,000,000.00

§ A96-18. Incorporation of application.

All of the commitments and statements contained in the application and any amendment thereto submitted in writing to the municipality by the company, except as modified herein, are binding upon the company as terms and conditions of this municipal consent. The application and any other relevant writings submitted by the company shall be considered a part of this ordinance and made a part hereof by reference as long as it does not conflict with state or federal law. All ordinances or parts of ordinances or other agreements between the Borough and the company that are in conflict with the provisions of this agreement are hereby declared invalid and superseded.

§ A96-19. Severability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court or federal or state agency of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and its validity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the ordinance.

§ A96-20. When effective.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon issuance of a renewal certificate of approval from the BPU.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY TO THE WASHINGTON BOROUGH VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY FOR NOMINAL CONSIDERATION

WHEREAS, the Borough is authorized by *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12-21.1 to sell personal property not needed for municipal purposes to certain organizations or associations identified in *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12-21 for nominal consideration; and

WHEREAS, volunteer fire companies are one of the organizations identified in *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12-21 to which such transfers may be made; and

WHEREAS, the Borough owns five (5) old-model vehicles which are not needed by the Borough, can no longer be operated and are of no practical use or value to the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Washington Borough Volunteer Fire Company has indicated an interest in acquiring these vehicles for use in training its volunteers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Washington, County of Warren that:

1. Ownership of the vehicles listed below is hereby transferred to the Washington Borough Volunteer Fire Company for \$1.00:





Per Council's request, I reached out again to the Township to re-confirm the costs associated with the crossing guards. As previously stated, the Borough was paying \$145,000 for crossing guards annually. With the amendment to the Shared Services Agreement recently approved by Council, if the same number of guards remain, this cost will be approximately \$100,000. This amount may be reduced further when the Chief of Police and Superintendent of Schools review the current guard posts and decide to reduce the number of posts. Per NJSA 40A:9-154, the guards report to the Chief of Police, who in conjunction with the schools make adjustments accordingly. As their review moves forward, I will keep you posted.

RESOLUTION 134-2010

ADOPTING CAFETERIA PLAN 125 MORE SPECIFICALLY KNOWN AS AND ENTITLED "BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON PREMIUM ONLY IRS CODE SECTION 125 PLAN" ATTACHED HERETO

WHEREAS, recent amendments to the State Health Benefits Program Act (N.J.S.A. 52:14-to 17.25 et seq.), now require that employees of local governments contribute 1.5% of base salary to the cost of health care coverage under the SHBP; and

WHEREAS, under 46 CFR 125 of the IRS Code (Code), commonly referred to as "cafeteria plan 125," (Plan) certain tax benefits accrue to both the employee and employer if the employer, instead of providing direct cash benefits to the employee (in the amount of 1.5% of base salary), makes a contribution, in like amount, on behalf of the employee, toward the cost of the employer's group health insurance plan premium; and

WHEREAS, the making of such a contribution is acknowledged, under the IRS Code, to be a "qualified benefit" meaning a non-taxable permitted benefit which is not subject to social security, Medicare, federal unemployment taxes or income tax withholding; and

WHEREAS, in order for such "cafeteria plan" to qualify under the "Code" so as to declare such contribution to be a "qualified benefit," the "Plan" must offer (among other requirements) the employee a choice between receiving a permitted but taxable benefit (i.e.: salary increase or other non-qualified financial benefit) and a permitted non-taxable qualified benefit (i.e.: employer contribution on behalf of the employee toward the health benefits plan premium); and

WHEREAS, under Section 1.2 of the Washington Cafeteria Plan 125, it is stated that the "purpose of this Plan is to provide participants with a choice between regular cash compensation and pretax treatment of group health insurance premium contributions; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer, Borough Manager and Borough Attorney have all reviewed this Plan, found it satisfactory and recommended its adoption by the Borough Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Washington, County of Warren, State of New Jersey as follows:

1. It hereby declares that it is its intention that this Washington Cafeteria Plan qualify as a "cafeteria plan" under Section 125 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

2. It hereby establishes and adopts the attached Washington Cafeteria Plan 125 which shall be known as the "Borough of Washington Premium Only IRS Code section 125 Plan."

Rich, as you are aware the Governor in his pension reform implemented several changes to the Health Insurance administration. One of those changes was charge of 1.5% of the gross base toward health insurance. In order to implement this change and at the same time offer our employee the maximum benefit, we need to adopt Cafeteria Plan (Plan 125). This IRS plan would allow our employees to have those payments made with pre-tax funding.

"PLAN DOCUMENT IRS CODE SECTION 125 CAFETERIA PLAN"

Article 1. *Introduction*.

- 1.1 Establishment; Purpose of Plan. The Employer adopts the Plan consisting of this Plan document. The name of the Plan shall be the Borough of Washington Premium Only IRS Code Section 125 Plan.
- 1.2 The purpose of this Plan is to provide Participants with a choice between regular cash compensation and pre-tax treatment of group health insurance premium contributions.
- 1.2 Cafeteria plan status. This Plan is intended to qualify as a "cafeteria plan" under Section125 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and is to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the requirements of Section 125.

Article 2. Definitions.

Wherever used in this Plan, the singular includes the plural and the following terms have the following meanings, unless a different meaning is clearly required by the context:

- 2.1 "Administrator" means the Employer or such other person or committee as may be appointed from time to time by the Employer to supervise the administration of the Plan.
- 2.2 "Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time. Reference to any section or subsection of the Code includes reference to any regulations there under and any comparable or succeeding provisions of any legislation which amends, supplements or replaces such section or subsection
- 2.3. "Coverage Period" means the Plan Year.
- 2.4. "Effective Date" means July 1, 2010.

- 2.5. "Eligible Employee" means an Employee who makes group health insurance premium contributions. An individual who does not meet the eligibility requirements shall not be eligible to participate in the Plan under any circumstances.
- 2.6. "Employee" means any individual who is employed by the Employer. Employee includes, by way of example and not by way of limitation, full-time Employees, part-time Employees, and Temporary Employees. Independent Contractors shall not be construed as Employees.
- 2.7 "Employer" means the Borough of Washington.
- 2.8 "Independent Contractor" means an individual that provides services not deemed to be employment.
- 2.9 "Participant" means any individual who participates in the Plan in accordance with Article 3.
- 2.10 "Plan" means the cafeteria plan set forth in this Plan document.
- 2.11 "Plan Year" means the one year period beginning each January 1, and ending each December 31 of the same year.

Article 3. Participation.

- 3.1. Commencement of participation. Each Eligible Employee will become a Participant in this Plan on the date he or she becomes an Eligible Employee, subject to his or her completion of the Plan Enrollment Form. Participation in this Plan means only that the Participant is entitled to contribute toward his or her share of the cost of group health insurance premiums on a pre-tax basis. The date participation in this Plan commences does not necessarily correspond with the effective date of any group health insurance premium contributions. Each Participant may elect the pre-tax treatment of their group health insurance premium contributions.
- 3.2. Cessation of participation. A Participant shall cease to be a Participant as of the earlier of (a) the date on which the Plan terminates (b) the date on which he or she ceases to be an Eligible Employee (c) a date not later than 3 months after the Participant notifies the Employer in writing of their desire to opt out of the Plan.

Article 4. Optional Benefit Coverages.

- 4.1. Coverage options. Each Participant may <u>choose</u> under this Plan <u>to receive his or her full compensation in cash or to have a portion of such compensation applied</u> by the Employer toward the cost of the group health insurance premium contribution.
- 4.2. Election procedure.

Prior to the commencement of each Coverage Period, the Administrator shall provide (or make available) a means of election for each Participant and for each other individual who is expected to become a Participant at the beginning of the applicable Coverage Period. The election shall be effective as of the first day of the Coverage Period.

- 4.3. New Participants. Before, or as soon as practicable after, an individual becomes a Participant under Section 3.1, the Administrator shall provide the means of election described in Section 4.4 to the individual. The Participant shall agree to a reduction in his or her compensation equal to the cost of the group health insurance premium contribution that he or she is legally obligated to make. Each election must be made on or before such date as the Administrator shall specify.
- 4.4. Failure to make election.
- (a) A new Participant's failure to make an election under Section 4.4 or 4.5 on or before the due date specified by the Administrator for the Coverage Period in which he or she becomes a Participant shall constitute an election by the Participant to receive his or her full compensation in cash. In so doing, a Participant opts to waive pre-tax treatment of his or her group health insurance premium contribution.
- 4.5. Revocation or change of election by the Participant during the Coverage Period. (a) Any election made under the Plan (including an election made through inaction under Section 4.6) shall be <u>irrevocable by the Participant during the Coverage Period</u>.

Article 5. Administration of Plan.

- 5.1. Plan Administrator. The administration of the Plan shall be under the supervision of the Administrator. It shall be a principal duty of the Administrator to see that the Plan is carried out, in accordance with its terms, for the exclusive benefit of persons entitled to participate in the Plan without discrimination among them. The Administrator will have full discretionary power to administer the Plan in all of its details, subject to applicable requirements of law. For this purpose, the Administrator's discretionary powers will include, but will not be limited to, the following discretionary authority, in addition to all other powers provided by this Plan:
- (a) To make and enforce such rules and regulations as it deems necessary or proper for the efficient administration of the Plan;
- (b) To interpret the Plan;
- (c) To decide all questions concerning the Plan and the eligibility of any person to participate in the Plan;
- (d) To appoint such agents, counsel, accountants, consultants and other persons as may be required to assist in administering the Plan.
- 5.2. Examination of records. The Administrator will make available to each Participant such of its records under the Plan as pertain to the Participant, for examination at reasonable times during normal business hours; provided, however, that the Administrator shall have no obligation to disclose any records or information which the

Administrator, in its sole discretion, determines to be of a privileged or confidential nature.

5.3. Nondiscriminatory exercise of authority. Whenever, in the administration of the Plan, any discretionary action by the Administrator is required, the Administrator shall exercise its authority in a nondiscriminatory manner so that all persons similarly situated will receive substantially the same treatment.

Article 6. Amendment and Termination of Plan.

- 6.1. Amendment of Plan. The power to amend the Plan, in whole or in part, shall be vested in the Employer, which shall have the sole discretion to make all amendments to the Plan or any of its provisions. Such amendment shall be effected by a written instrument signed by a duly authorized representative of the Employer, or his or her authorized delegate, and delivered to the Administrator.
- 6.2. Termination of Plan. The Employer has established the Plan with the bona fide intention and expectation that it will be continued indefinitely, but the Employer will have no obligation whatsoever to maintain the Plan for any given length of time and may discontinue or terminate the Plan at any time, without liability, by a written instrument signed by a duly authorized representative of the Employer, or his or her authorized delegate, and delivered to the Administrator.

Article 7. Miscellaneous Provisions.

- 7.1. Information to be furnished. Participants shall provide the Employer and the Administrator with such information and evidence, and shall sign such documents, as may reasonably be requested from time to time for the purpose of administration of the Plan.
- 7.2. Limitation of rights. Neither the establishment of the Plan nor any amendment thereof, nor the payment of any benefits, will be construed as giving to any Participant or other person any legal or equitable right against the Employer nor the Administrator, except as provided herein.
- 7.3. Employment Not Guaranteed. Nothing contained in the Plan nor shall any action taken hereunder be construed as a contract of employment or as giving any Employee any right to be retained in the employ of the Employer.
- 7.4. Governing law. Except to the extent federal law applies, this Plan shall be construed, administered and enforced according to the laws of the <u>State of New Jersey</u>.
