The Regular Meeting of the Borough Council of Washington, Warren County, New Jersey was held in the Council Chambers of Borough Hall at 7:00 P.M.

Mayor McDonald led everyone in the flag salute.

#### Regular Meeting Minutes – September 4, 2012

Motion made by Higgins, seconded by Jewell to approve the minutes of September 4, 2012.

Mayor McDonald noted the only change is: "Council requested the Borough Manager obtain a copy of Washington Township's Jake Breaking Ordinance"

#### Council Discussion:

Mayor McDonald proposed that Council grant Washington Community Solar their extension. Councilman Higgins noted that in their letter it says they agree to pave the 800 foot access subject to "reasonable review". Attorney Kopen stated that she discussed that issue with Mr. Andrew Holt. Attorney Kopen suggested that Council pass the motion stating that it is completed to the satisfaction of the Municipal Engineer. Councilman Torres questioned the timeline of the work. Manager Blanchard stated that the work would be completed in early spring pending weather.

Motion made by Higgins to grant Community Solar their extension and that the work is to be completed to the satisfaction of the Municipal Engineer, seconded by Jewell and approved.

Mayor McDonald asked at this time if there were any motions to be made on the letter from the Planning Board regarding the Washington Square/Jade Acquisition. There was no discussion.

#### Council Discussion:

Councilman Higgins noted that the Tax Collector's Report is from August. Manager Blanchard stated that it will be up to date at the next meeting.

#### **COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**Shared Service Committee** 

Councilman Higgins stated that the Shared Service Committee met Tuesday with Washington Township. Initially Council asked for quarterly reports, however, the Washington Township CFO said that was impossible so the Shared Service Committee suggested semi annual reports. Washington Township will amend the language in the agreement to put requirements in place that Township will provide Council with actual expenditures semi annually and at year end. Mayor McDonald suggested we include a July 15<sup>th</sup> deadline for the mid year report.

Motion made by Higgins, seconded by Gleba to have the Borough Manager contact the Washington Township Administrator to amend the language in the Shared Service contract to provide semi annual reporting.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Discussion - Best Practice Checklist

Borough Manager Blanchard stated that we have to go through the checklist which asks questions about how we run the Borough office. The Borough is still at 100% aid from the state, so we have lost no aid. We have done a great job.

Councilwoman Gleba asked about the questions that we answered "NO" to. First one being the workman's comp issue. We do not limit to 7%, if a worker goes out on workman's comp the Borough pays them and then the Borough is reimbursed by the third party workman's comp agency.

Borough Manager Blanchard stated that if an employee takes a municipal vehicle home, it has to be noted on their paycheck for IRS reasons. Manager Blanchard also stated that she has requested the vehicle use policies that other municipalities have in place and will present that to council in the near future. Changing the Pay to Play Ordinances and the possibility of having Council attend a mandatory training session was also discussed. No decision was made.

The Borough Manager just needs to sign the paperwork from the State of NJ saying that this discussion of the Best Practices Checklist took place in a public meeting.

**WHEREAS,** the proposal will enable the Town to offer scrap metal recycling to its residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the value of services involved is below the bid threshold.

WHEREAS, Halloween Night and several nights before and after have historically been nights when acts of criminal mischief and vandalism have increased throughout the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Washington desires to take some action to help reduce the likelihood of such incidents establishing a suggested curfew to assist parents and lawful guardians of minor children; and

**WHEREAS**, said curfew is viewed as an important part of maintaining the peace and order of the community and all persons are strongly urged to cooperate with the Washington Township Police Department abiding by the curfew. The Mayor and Council suggest that this curfew be imposed on all minors in their care and custody; and

**WHEREAS**, the door to door solicitation of treats is a tradition enjoyed by many as well as an annoyance and inconvenience to others and, therefore needs to be regulated to provide for the safety, health and welfare of all persons within the community.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Washington, in the County of Warren, State of New Jersey agrees that there is hereby established a suggested curfew for all persons seventeen (17) years of age or younger of 9:00 p.m. from Monday, October 29, 2012 up to and including Wednesday, October 31, 2012. Curfew shall be extended for school - sponsored events to one (1) hour after the conclusion of the event.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that Trick or Treat shall be observed with the Borough of Washington on Wednesday, October 31, 2012 from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Councilwoman Gleba also inquired about all the general bond payments. Manager Blanchard responded that those payments came from the capital account associated with those bonds. Councilwoman Gleba also asked if the Recreation Commission was allowed to make donations. Manager Blanchard answered that they are allowed and also stated that even Borough Council has made donations in the past.

aid we have received in the past few years. Manager Blanchard will get in touch with the Risk Manager on workman's compensation payments. Finally, Manager Blanchard will find out who is responsible for the tree stumps when JCP&L cuts them down.

#### **COUNCIL REMARKS:**

Councilman Boyle noted that he did get a response from the Boro of Hampton and they are not going to move forward with the garbage collection proposal. Thanks to Councilman Higgins on his hard work and dedication to Resolution 141-2012 which pertains to the agreement with Cinelli Iron and Metal Co. for recycling of scrap metal.

Councilman Jewell encouraged everyone to go out and have fun at the Borough Festival.

Councilman Higgins stated that some of the caution lights in the crosswalk are out. Manager Blanchard stated there are new ones on order free of charge. Councilman Higgins also asked if our disposal contract was up at the end of this year. Manager Blanchard replied that it is up at the end of 2013.

Councilman Torres wants all residents to know that there has been a wave of vandalism and to be on the lookout. Any citizens who see anything suspicious should call the police. Councilman Torres also stated that the Borough of Washington has an official flag and he would like to look into having that flag erected outside in front of Borough Hall.

Councilwoman Gleba also encouraged residents to come out to the BID Festival. Councilwoman Gleba stated that the Hometown Holiday and Santa's Arrival is scheduled for November 30<sup>th</sup> and December 1<sup>st</sup>. They are in need of volunteers to help out. Councilwoman Gleba reminded everyone that the Recreation Commission is holding their 1<sup>st</sup> Annual 5K on the 13<sup>th</sup>. She also stated that she has noticed a lack of police presence downtown. Manager Blanchard stated that she will give a call to the police chief regarding this matter.

Mayor McDonald also stated for everyone to enjoy themselves at the BID Festival in the Borough.
