# **COUNCIL APPEARANCE:**

Michael Iannitelli – Parade Masonic Lodge

Mr. Iannitelli stated that the Masonic Lodge would like to hold a 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration next year on May 31<sup>st</sup>. The Lodge is planning a parade and calling it the Two Mile Journey over Two Hundred Years. The parade route will start where the Washington House once stood, and continue to the present building. This is all pending raising enough funds and approvals from Washington Borough, Washington Township, and the State of New Jersey. Mr. Iannitelli stated that he is trying to minimize the amount of interference with Route's 57 and 31. Mr. Iannitelli is here tonight for

permission to conduct part of the parade in Washington Borough and permission to utilize some of the municipal parking lots for staging and set up of the parade.

Council Discussion:

Councilwoman Gleba asked Mr. Iannitelli if he contacted the Washington Township Police. Mr. Iannitelli replied that he was in contact with the Washington Township Police and the feedback he received is that they need to know the parade route and that's about it. Mayor McDonald asked how large the parade would be. Mr. Iannitelli replied that he would like it to be as large as possible but he would be pleased if he had half the participation that is involved in the Washington Celebrate's America parade held on July 4<sup>th</sup>.

A motion was made by Higgins, seconded by Gleba to grant permission for the parade route to go through Washington Borough and permission to utilize the municipal parking lots conditional on the approvals from Washington Township and the State of New Jersey.

Councilman Higgins also asked Mr. Iannitelli to come back and provide Council with an update a few months prior to the parade once everything is in place.

#### Sewer Committee:

Councilman Higgins provided an update to Council in regards to sending a survey crew to Gardeners Court. Councilman Higgins stated that unfortunately, there is not enough elevation to put in the pipes they thought they could. Councilman Higgins added that Manager Blanchard received some information from the sewer engineer today that now the engineer is looking into a vacuum system for that area since there is a problem with the elevation. Councilman Higgins stated that information should be provided to the Sewer Committee within the next week or two.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Best Practices – 2013

#### Council Discussion:

Manager Blanchard stated that she is required to present the Best Practices Worksheets to Council and answer any questions. Manager Blanchard pointed out that there's a few things such as a Finance Committee that Council may want to think about for the future. Manager Blanchard also noted that the question regarding mandatory classes for elected officials continues to come up. Manager Blanchard stated that the classes have to be Division of Local Government sponsored classes which the cost would need to be added to the budget. Resolution #186-2013 Power Purchase Agreement Extension

#### **RESOLUTION #186-2013**

### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CLERK TO EXECUTE AN AMENDMENT TO THE POWER PURCHASE AGREEMENT WITH WASHINGTON COMMUNITY SOLAR, LLC

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Washington ("Borough") and Washington Community Solar, LLC ("WCS") entered into a Power Purchase Agreement ("PPA") dated January 17, 2012, for the purpose of providing solar energy to certain Borough facilities through solar facilities to be constructed by WCS on property in Washington Township adjacent to property owned by the Borough; and

**WHEREAS**, by the terms of the PPA, WCS had six months from the Effective Date of the PPA to obtain all required State and local regulatory permits, consents and approvals to enable it to construct its solar facilities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the request of WCS the Borough earlier granted, by way of Resolution 69-2013, an approximate three month extension of time, until September 30, 2013, for WCS to obtain the required permits and consents and until December 31, 2013 to begin providing electricity to the Borough as required by the PPA; and

**WHEREAS**, WCS has advised that the approval process has taken longer than anticipated and has, therefore, requested an additional 7 month extension of the time to obtain approvals, until April 30, 2014, and a corresponding extension to the electrical generation deadline from December 31, 2013 until July 31, 2014; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council have reviewed the request of WCS for an extension of time to obtain its approvals and provide electrical generation and have determined that the request should be granted;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Washington, County of Warren, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The Mayor and Council consent to the amendment of Section 2 of the PPA to provide that Washington Community Solar, LLC shall have until April 30, 2014 to obtain all required State and local regulatory permits, consents and approvals, to design, permit, acquire, construct and install its solar facility.

2. The Mayor and Council also consent to the amendment of Section 3.3A of the PPA to provide that Washington Community Solar, LLC shall be allowed an extension until July 31, 2014, that Washington Community Solar shall commence the delivery and sale of the electricity to the Borough.

3. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to sign a letter agreement to be prepared by the Borough Attorney amending Section 2 and Section 3.3A of the PPA as set forth above.

Councilman Torres noticed that the Borough does not have any containers down town for recycling next to the garbage cans. Councilman Torres would like to purchase some recycling containers using the Clean Communities Grant. Manager Blanchard will look into some pricing options. Councilman Torres also asked for an update on the flag that is supposed to be located outside the library. Manager Blanchard spoke to the Library Director and there was supposed to be a flag donated to the library and possibly a

ceremony including the Girls Scouts. Manager Blanchard will follow up with the Library Director.

Councilwoman Gleba asked for a revenue report to be added to the next Council packet. Councilman Thompson asked for a revenue report for each department. Councilwoman Gleba replied that the latest year to date report was just posted to the website. Manager Blanchard will provide Councilman Thompson with a hard copy.

Councilman Higgins added that the flag is supposed to be at half mast by order of the Governor of New Jersey. Councilman Higgins stated that the oldest living Medal of Honor recipient died on October 4, 2013 and was a resident of New Jersey. Manager Blanchard will look into signing up for an email alert as to when the flag should be at half mast.
