WASHINGTON BOROUGH COUNCIL MINUTES – February 04, 2014**

The Regular Meeting of the Borough Council of Washington, Warren County, New Jersey was held in the Council Chambers of Borough Hall at 7:00 P.M.

Mayor McDonald read the following statement into the record:

“The requirements of the ‘Open Public Meetings Law, 1975, Chapter 231’ have been satisfied in that adequate notice of this meeting has been published in the Star Gazette and posted on the Bulletin Board of Borough Hall stating the time, place and purpose of the meeting as required by law.”

Mayor McDonald stated that Council has a number of Boy Scouts in the audience. Representing Pack 145, Den 6 is Conner McDaniel who led everyone in the flag salute.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Mayor McDonald notes that there is correspondence from the State of New Jersey regarding the Borough’s Wastewater Management Plan.

A motion was made by Higgins, seconded by Gleba to receive and file the correspondence.

Council Discussion:

Councilman Higgins stated that he had the opportunity of meeting Mr. Dean Durling, the President and CEO of Quick Check. According to Mr. Chris Jepson, the Borough’s Sewer Engineer, Washington Township has taken Quick Check out of their Wastewater Management Plan. Councilman Higgins added that Quick Check wants to hook up to the Borough’s Wastewater Management Plan as soon as possible which in turn means revenue for the Borough. Councilman Higgins also stated that all Quick Check has to do is obtain the proper permits to open the street and connect into the Borough’s sewer system.

OLD BUSINESS:

Councilwoman Gleba performed some research for Council's knowledge and to help make an educated decision moving forward in regards to Recreation and the overall budget. Councilwoman Gleba reached out to the Mayors of Lopatcong and Belvidere since they both have pools in their municipalities. Councilwoman Gleba asked the respective towns what their annual contributions to their Recreation Commissions are and if their annual contributions cover salaries. Councilwoman Gleba also asked if they have a Recreation Director and if that individual is full time or part time and their salary. Councilwoman Gleba stated that in Lopatcong, the Recreation Commission has no involvement with the operation of the parks and pool which could change in the future. There is a budget appropriation under parks and playgrounds covering salaries and operating expenses. The appropriation for salaries is \$60,000 and \$75,250 for operating expenses. Councilwoman Gleba added that in Lopatcong there are four employees who are Certified Pool Operators paid \$10 per hour who manages the daily operations. The township clerk and her staff handle the overall operations and that individual reports directly to the Council and Mayor. The budget appropriations cover the maintenance of the park and the pool expenses. Lopatcong's DPW is responsible for the overall

maintenance, set up and breakdown of the pool. There is also a small seasonal crew that performs the daily maintenance.

Councilwoman Gleba stated that Belvidere has no Recreation Commission or Committee therefore any need for a Director. All the recreation activities in Belvidere are run by private organizations. The town runs a one month long summer recreation program that is paid for out of a recreation trust account. The account is supported by the fees charged for program so it pays for itself. Councilwoman Gleba added that many years ago Belvidere created a pool utility, which means that the pool supports itself and has it's own budget outside of the town's municipal budget. The town does pay for the electricity, liability insurance and the DPW does provide some maintenance. There are two DPW employees who hold their CPO license. The main recreation field is owned by the town, so Belvidere does provide the mowing and the liability insurance but the maintenance such as marking the fields is done by the private organizations. The town maintains the insurance for all sports programs, but charges a per player fee for each sport that is paid for by the organization to the town at the end of the respective season. The pool utility is managed by the pool commission which is all volunteers with oversight and final approval coming from the governing body. Councilwoman Gleba added that Belvidere has a pool manager that works May through August at \$16 per hour and two assistant managers at \$11.50 per hour. The pool is open 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. every day. The manager conducts all job interviews and also attends all pool commission meetings.

Mayor McDonald added for the audience's sake that the Borough's part time Recreation Director has resigned and the Borough is looking into the possibility of creating a full time position. Mayor McDonald stated that Councilwoman Gleba's research has been very helpful.

Councilman Torres questioned the purchase of heaters which was listed under public works. Manager Blanchard replied that heaters were purchased for the municipal building to keep the offices warm while the boiler was not working. Manager Blanchard added that the new boiler will be installed on Friday, February 7th and take approximately two days. The building will be closed on Friday due to the lack of utilities.

Manager Blanchard will reach out to Quick Check to plan a meeting in order to discuss hooking into the Borough's sewer system. Manager Blanchard will also provide Council with the recreation research performed by Councilwoman Gleba.

COUNCIL REMARKS:

Councilman Thompson stated for everyone to stay warm, stay safe and have a good weekend.

Councilman Higgins asked if the budget workshop is on February 11th. Manager Blanchard replied that there will be a budget meeting on Tuesday, February 11th at 7:00 p.m. Councilman Higgins also asked how the Borough is doing in terms of with the amount of salt left for the winter. Manager Blanchard replied that there is a salt shortage in the State of New Jersey. Manager Blanchard added that both of the Borough's salt distributors are just about out of salt. Manager Blanchard stated that the Borough will do

what they can to get by with what's left. Councilman Higgins also asked if it was determined if the windows used in the Paramount building being renovated downtown are the proper windows. Councilwoman Conry replied that she will inquire at the next Planning Board meeting which is Monday.

Councilman Torres thanked the D.P.W for the great job during the last snow storm. Councilman Torres also thanked Councilwoman Gleba for her research on Recreation Departments in the area. Councilman Torres noted that he observed Manager Blanchard in action and noticed the public professionalism that she displayed in regards to residents receiving parking tickets during snow removal. Councilman Torres also expressed concern about the fire at the former Brownfield Tile building. This was another vacant building which is an issue that needs to be addressed. Councilman Torres thanked the Washington Borough Fire Department for their prompt response in putting the fire out.

Councilwoman Gleba read the following letter from the Warren Hills High School into the record:

Mayor McDonald thanked Boy Scout Pack 145, Den 6 for coming out tonight. Mayor McDonald added that he would be happy to answer any of the scout's questions after the meeting.

Frances Wheeler – 67 North Jackson Avenue

Mrs. Wheeler stated that for the first time in ten years, she received a parking ticket. The issue is that she owns the portion of the road in front of her home that she parks on. Mrs. Wheeler added that she received a parking ticket for being parked in front of her home during the last snow storm. Mrs. Wheeler stated that her survey shows that she owns that portion of the road. Manager Blanchard replied that since a ticket was issued, Mrs.

Wheeler will have to take her survey to the court to dispute the charge. Councilman Torres stated there are several issues of ownership on North Jackson Avenue and a title search is something he feels should be done to answer these questions. Councilwoman Gleba noted that nothing has changed in the no parking on street during snow removal ordinance which has been in effect for some time. Last year, Council repealed the overnight parking ordinance which cause confusion during the first snowfall this year. This confusion caused tremendous difficulties for the D.P.W. to plow the snow properly. Mrs. Wheeler will provide Manager Blanchard a copy of her survey along with a letter from the Tax Assessor which confirms the ownership of that portion of the road on the survey.

Janice Cummings – 101 Park Avenue

Mrs. Cummings stated that her driveway is on a blind curve and has had many close calls due to other cars speeding by. Mrs. Cummings asked if it's possible to have a sign for drivers to slow down or alerting drivers of a hidden driveway. Manager Blanchard will reach out to the engineer to see if there is anything Borough can do.

Donald Laznovsky – 14 Lenape Trail

Mr. Laznovsky had a question regarding ordinances and the fines associated with them. Mr. Laznovsky received a fine for not shoveling the sidewalk while on vacation and questioned why the range is up to \$500. Mr. Laznovsky just wanted to pay the fine instead of going to court but couldn't because nobody could tell him the amount. Manager Blanchard replied that municipalities give the fine a range when they adopt an ordinance and the amount is at the judge's discretion. Mayor McDonald added that typically a judge will start at the low end. Mr. Laznovsky did not care for the attitude of the prosecutor that spoke to him like he was a child which was very insulting. Mr. Laznovsky feels there should have been a set fine that he could have paid without going to court.

At this time, Councilman Torres apologized to Mrs. Wheeler for the difficulties that she is having with the Borough's communications and he hopes to improve that in the future.

Dear Mayor McDonald, Deputy Mayor Gleba and Council Members Higgins, Thompson, Torres and Conry:

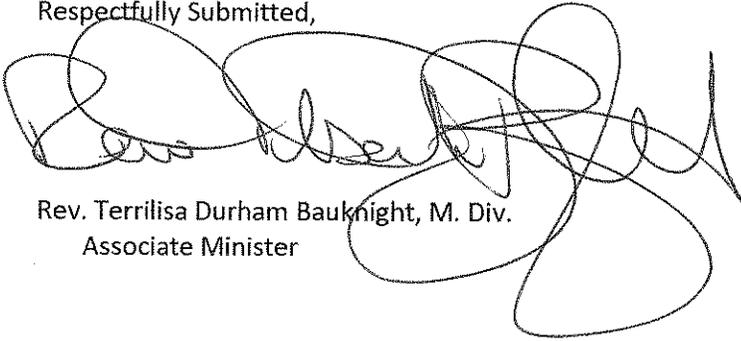
On behalf of the Officers and Members of Mt. Pisgah AME Church, I am writing regarding our recent absence from the Council Meetings. Please know that we remain interested in not only the discussions and action taken regarding North Lincoln Avenue, but also the activities and events regarding all of the Borough of Washington.

Please note that since the Fall, we have discovered that the sign noting the 'private road' at the end of North Lincoln was rediscovered. The problem was that the growth of a bush and other shrubbery. This problem will occur again come the Spring. Who is responsible for the maintenance of the shrubbery and other growth? That is something that will need to be addressed when the time comes, which will be soon enough. We can report that there have been officers who are watching the church parking lot. I can personally report this because an officer on a Sunday afternoon passed and then backed up to check out who was in the lot – it was me. Yet, just two (2) Sunday's past, we were unable to get the license plate of an individual who came barreling through the canal road and made the attempt to turn around in our parking lot. It was very difficult due to the ice and snow that was on the ground. We have advised all members to be aware and should someone other than members or intended visitors come into the lot they are to take note of the color, type of vehicle, and the plate number as well as the time. We will then continue to compile our information.

Finally, we continue to wait to hear of news regarding the grant which will help to repair and pave N. Lincoln. With the harsh winter weather the road is deteriorating quickly. Larger holes have appeared and the road is even bumpier

**AUTHORIZING MEMBERSHIP IN A MUTUAL AID AND ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT
WITH PARTICIPATING UNITS**

WHEREAS, mutual aid and assistance agreements between municipalities, counties, law enforcement agencies, police, fire departments, EMS organizations and Fire Districts are permitted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 14-26 and 40A: 14-156.1; and

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD- 5), directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach to Federal, State, local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity; and

WHEREAS, "The New Jersey Civilian Defense and Disaster Control Act" App. N.J.S.A.9-33 et. seq, provides for the health, safety and welfare of the people of the State of New Jersey during any emergency by centralizing control of all civilian activities having to do with such emergency giving the Governor control over the resources of each and every political subdivision to cope with any condition that shall arise out of such emergency, and

WHEREAS, The Director of the Division of Fire Safety in the Department of Community Affairs promulgated rules in accordance with the "Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Act," N.J.A.C. 52:14E-11 et. seq., commonly referred to as the "Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Regulations" N.J.A.C. 5:75A et. seq., and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interests of the residents of this municipality to enter into a mutual aid and assistance agreement with the County of Warren and other municipalities including, but not limited to, municipal police, fire departments and EMS organizations to provide additional protection against loss, damage or destruction by fire, catastrophe, civil unrest, major emergency or other extraordinary devastation damage or destruction to person and property, in those situations when outside aid and assistance is needed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the _____

That the _____ is hereby authorized and directed to forthwith file a certified copy of this Resolution and an executed copy of the Agreement with the Warren County Department of Public Safety, Office of Emergency Management. Said Office shall serve as the central repository and shall maintain a master listing of all Participating Units to the Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreement.

**WARREN COUNTY
MUTUAL AID AND ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT
BETWEEN PARTICIPATING MUNICIPALITIES AND AGENCIES**

THIS AGREEMENT is made between the parties set forth on Schedule A (attached hereto) all of which include the County of Warren and all of its departments all participating municipalities including, but not limited to, municipal police, public works, fire departments, EMS organizations, Fire Districts and other jurisdictions defined as “local governments” in the Homeland Security Act of 2002. Hereinafter the parties may be referred to as “Participating Units”, “Requesting Units” or “Responding Units”.

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD - 5), directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach to Federal, State, local¹ and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity; and

WHEREAS, “The New Jersey Civilian Defense and Disaster Control Act” App.N.J.S.A.9-33 et. seq, provides for the health, safety and welfare of the people of the State of New Jersey during any emergency by centralizing control of all civilian activities having to do with such emergency giving the Governor control over the resources of each and every political subdivision to cope with any condition that shall arise out of such emergency, and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey adopted the “Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Act,” N.J.S.A. 52:14E-11 et. seq., to establish a mechanism for the coordination of fire service resources throughout the State to facilitate a quick and efficient response to any emergency incident or situation that requires the immediate deployment of those resources in order to protect life and property from the danger or destruction of fire, explosion or other disaster, and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Division of Fire Safety in the Department of Community Affairs promulgated rules commonly referred to as the “Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Regulations” N.J.A.C. 5:75A et. seq, and N.J.A.C. 5:75 A-2.2 specifically requires each municipality or fire district to adopt a local fire mutual aid plan, and

WHEREAS, an emergency responder is defined as anyone employed by, contracted to provide services, volunteer or otherwise affiliated with the Participating Units and possessing special skills, qualifications, training, knowledge and experience beneficial to the mitigation of disaster situations. An emergency responder includes, but is in no way limited to, the following: law enforcement officers, fire fighters, emergency medical services personnel, physicians, nurses, other public health personnel, emergency management personnel, public works personnel, those persons with specialized equipment operations skills or training or any other skills needed to provide aid in an emergency.

¹ As defined in the Homeland Security Act of 2002, Section 2(10): the term “local government” means “(A) county, municipality, city, town, township, local public authority, school district, intrastate district, council of governments...regional or interstate government entity, or agency or instrumentality of a local government: an Indian tribe or authorized tribal organization, or in Alaska a Native village or Alaska Regional Native Corporation; and a rural community, unincorporated town or village, or other public entity.” 6 U.S.C. 101(10)

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WHEREAS, the Participating Units recognize that entering into an agreement for mutual aid and assistance with each other to protect against loss, damage or destruction by fire, catastrophe, civil unrest, major emergency or other extraordinary devastation and will address those situations when additional aid and assistance is needed will protect the best interests of the persons and property in each individual jurisdiction.

WITNESSETH:

In consideration of the mutual benefits and covenants contained in this agreement, the Participating Units respectively agree as follows:

1. **Mutual Aid and Assistance**. Upon the request as provided herein, the Participating Units shall provide mutual aid and assistance to each other. Mutual Aid and Assistance shall include the following:
 - a. Rendering of aid and assistance, including pre-established immediate response by one or more Participating Units to an emergency scene under the control and/or jurisdiction of another Participating Unit, said emergency may include but not to be limited to fire, civil unrest, major criminal or emergency events, natural and man-made disaster or catastrophe affecting the environment.
 - b. Rendering of aid and assistance by one or more Participating Units to another Participating Unit to serve as supplemental reserve protection in the Requesting Unit's jurisdiction while the Requesting Unit is on an emergency call and/or otherwise currently unable to address the emergency service needs in its jurisdiction.
 - c. Participating in training exercises with other participating units, where the purpose of such training exercises is to coordinate and prepare for fire, civil unrest, major emergency, natural disaster, environmental disaster and/or other emergency situations that are a threat to life or property.
2. **Requests for Mutual Aid and Assistance**. All requests for mutual aid and assistance shall be initiated through the Warren County Department of Public Safety, Communications Center, the Warren County Fire Coordinator, the Warren County EMS Coordinator, the Warren County Emergency Management Coordinator, the Warren County Prosecutor or his designee in accordance with all procedures in effect at the time of the request. The Warren County Communications Center shall immediately summon Participating Units to the scene of an emergency in accordance with the pre-established policies and procedures in effect at the time of the request.
 - a. Each local jurisdiction shall develop a Municipal Mutual Aid Plan to include mutual aid assistance to the levels they deem acceptable when measured against potential risks. Said information shall be submitted annually to the Warren County Department of Public Safety, Office of Emergency Management for review by the appropriate coordinator prior to the first day of March each year.
 - i. All Local Fire Mutual Aid Plans shall be in compliance with the New Jersey Fire Service Emergency Deployment Rules N.J.A.C. 5:75A et seq, specifically N.J.A.C. 5:75A-2.2.

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- ii. The County Fire Coordinator, the County EMS Coordinator or the County Prosecutor, where appropriate, will implement the Mutual Aid Plan for jurisdictions/agencies failing to submit plans as required in Section 2.a. above.
3. **Tactical Command and Authority at Emergency Scene.** The Incident Commander of the Requesting Unit shall have overall command authority of all Participating Units except where the authority of the Warren County Prosecutors Office controls the scene of the emergency. Participating Units of the fire service shall operate in compliance with the State Incident Management System N.J.A.C. 5:73-1.6(b).
4. **No Charge for Use of Personnel or Equipment.**
 - a. No Participating Unit shall bill a Requesting Unit for wages, salaries or use of equipment in making mutual aid and assistance responses, except as is provided for by a pre-existing separate agreement and/or as permitted within the regulations of the Stafford Disaster and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. 5121-5206 and the implementing regulations of 44 CFR 204 and 206 in which case reimbursements as permitted therein shall be recoverable as provided within said regulations.
 - b. If fuel, chemical substances, crowd control gases, water additives, sterilized medical equipment or other disposable goods are used for mitigation of the incident by a Responding Unit at a mutual aid and assistance response which will cause the Responding Unit to incur an expenditure to replace the same, and/or portable equipment requires repair or is lost, the Requesting Unit shall replace or, upon receipt of an appropriate voucher, reimburse the Responding Unit for the expenditure involved. Said reimbursement or replacement shall not be construed as payment or consideration for making the mutual aid and assistance response but only as an effort to compensate a Responding Unit for its actual cost outlay in replacing these expendable materials.
 - c. This agreement does not supersede any agreement either formal or informal between jurisdictions (e.g. state or federal governments) or between Responding Units (e.g. fire departments of different municipalities).
 - d. Participating Units, when possible, will be reimbursed in accordance with the Spill Compensation Control Act (N.J.A.C. 7:1E-5.3/N.J.S.A. 58:10-23.11e).
 - e. This agreement recognizes the provisions as required by New Jersey Civilian Defense & Control Act App. N.J.S.A. 9-33 et seq. and specifically Emergency Medical Services N.J.S.A.26:2K-60.
5. **Limitation of Providing Mutual Aid and Assistance.** Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to require a Participating Unit to make a mutual aid and assistance response if the response will leave the Participating Unit's jurisdiction without sufficient police, fire, ambulance and/or emergency protection.
6. **Death or Disability.** If any member of a Participating Unit suffers injury or death at the scene of a mutual aid and assistance emergency or training exercise, the member or the member's designee or legal representative shall be entitled to all salary, pension rights, worker's compensation and other benefits to which the member would be entitled if injury or death occurred in the

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performance of duties within the jurisdiction of the Participating Unit in accordance to N.J.S.A.40A: 14-26. Said rights, benefits and compensation shall be paid by the Participating Unit and not by the Requesting Unit. Each Participating Unit shall be individually responsible for providing adequate benefits, coverage and compensation for its members.

7. **Members Authority.** The members of each Participating Unit making a mutual aid and assistance response shall have the same powers and authority as the members of a Requesting Unit at the scene of the emergency in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A: 14-156.2. Said members of a Participating Unit shall also have, while so acting, such rights and immunities as they would otherwise enjoy in the performance of their normal duties within their own jurisdiction.
8. **Liability Insurance.** Each Participating Unit shall maintain adequate liability insurance, the minimum limits of which shall be \$1 million. Additionally, the Requesting Unit agrees to hold harmless a Participating Unit in the event of any lawsuit arising out of such assistance.
9. **Term: Withdrawal.** This Agreement shall commence upon the signature of each of the Participating Units. Any Participating Unit may withdraw from this Agreement by providing all other Participating Units, the Warren County Department of Public Safety, the County Fire Coordinator, the County EMS Coordinator, and the County Prosecutor or his designee with sixty (60) days advanced written notice of withdraw, clearly specifying the applicable date of withdrawal. In the event of withdrawal by any Participating Unit, this Agreement will continue in full force and effect for all remaining Participating Units.
10. **Legal Authority.** This Agreement for mutual aid and assistance is expressly made in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A: 14-26 and 156.1 et seq.
11. **Entire Agreement.** This agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the Participating Units. This Agreement supersedes all communications, representations or prior agreements, oral or written, between Participating Units with respect to the subject matter hereof.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the County of Warren, each Municipality, Police Department, Fire Department, EMS Organization and Fire District has executed this Agreement and affixed its corporate seal on the date indicated. By executing this agreement, each Participating Unit acknowledges that said execution has been duly authorized by proper Resolution, a copy of which is annexed to this agreement.
