### ORDINANCE 2019-17 AN ORDINANCE TO MANDATE DIRECT DEPOSIT FOR COMPENSATION FOR MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES OF THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2019 PURSUANT TO <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 52:14-15f

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 52:14-15f authorizes local governments to mandate direct deposit for compensation for certain governmental employees effective July 1, 2014; and

**WHEREAS**, N.T.S.A. 52:14-15f permits governing bodies to grant exemptions to the direct deposit requirements on such terms and conditions as they deem necessary; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Washington, in

the County of Warren, as follows:

#### SECTION 1.

- A. All full-time employees, part-time employees, and elected public officials who receive compensation from the Borough of Washington are mandated to have direct deposit of their compensation as of September 1, 2019 in accordance with NJ.S.A. 52:14-15f.
- B. Municipal employees may request an exemption from the direct deposit requirements of this Ordinance by written request to the Municipal Manager of the Borough of Washington. A decision on such request will be considered by the Borough Manager within seven (7) days of receipt. The Borough Manager may grant an exemption from the requirements of this Ordinance for good cause shown on such terms and conditions as the Borough Manager may deem necessary.

**SECTION 2.** If any Section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the Section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deeded valid and effective.

**SECTION 3.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION 4.** This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption, passage and publication according to law. The Direct Deposit mandate shall be effective September 1, 2019.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Governing Body of the Borough of Washington in the County of Warren State of New Jersey, hereby requests the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to approve the insertion of an item of revenue in the budget of the year 2019 in the sum of \$12,000.00 which is now available from the State of New Jersey, Highland Water Protection and Planning Council

# RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON AS A STIGMA-FREE COMMUNITY

**WHEREAS,** the Warren County Board of Chosen Freeholders, along with the Warren County Department of Human Services, supports the designation of **Stigma-Free Communities** in every municipality, and;

**WHEREAS,** the Warren County Board of Chosen Freeholders unanimously passed a resolution supporting the designation of Warren County as a Stigma-Free Community, and;

**WHEREAS,** Warren County recognizes that one in four Americans has experienced mental illness, including substance use disorders, in a given year according to the National Institute of Mental Health, and;

**WHEREAS,** mental health problems are more common than cancer and heart disease combined, affecting children and adults, including more than half of our Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans treated at Veteran's Administration hospitals, and;

**WHEREAS,** given the serious nature of this public health problem, we must continue to reach the millions who need help;

**WHEREAS,** the stigma associated with the disease of mental illness is identified as the primary reason individuals fail to seek the help they need to recover from the disease, and;

**WHEREAS, Stigma-Free Communities** aim to inspire public interest and open dialogues about stigma, raise awareness of the disease of mental illness and create a culture wherein residents who have the disease of mental illness feel supported by their community and neighbors and feel free to seek treatment for the disease without fear of stigma and;

WHEREAS, promoting awareness that there can be no "health" without mental health will break down barriers and encourage residents of all ages to be mindful of their mental health and ask for help when needed, and;

**WHEREAS,** local resources are available to treat the disease of mental illness so no one resident needs to suffer alone or feel hopeless, and;

WHEREAS, establishing Stigma-Free Communities will raise awareness of resources and encourage residents to engage in care as soon as the need is identified so recovery can begin, hope is inspired and tragedies are avoided, and;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that Borough of Washington recognizes the community needs and supports the efforts of the County of Warren in designating the Borough of Washington as a **Stigma-Free Community.**

#### RESOLUTION 2019-112 AUTHORIZING AWARD OF CONTRACT TO TOP LINE CONSTRUCTION CORP. OF SOMERVILLE, NEW JERSEY FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF GRAND AVE.

**WHEREAS**, the Washington Borough Manager and the Borough Engineer determined that the need for the acquisition of the following goods and services; Grande Ave: and

WHEREAS, the project will consist of improvement to Grand Ave and all construction excavation item are identified in bid form; and

**WHEREAS**, a notice of advertisement for bid were prepared and advertised in accordance with the Local Public Contract Law; and

WHEREAS, sealed bid was open and read on Wednesday June 26, 2019 in accordance with the requirements of the Local Public Contract Law and;

**WHEREAS,** Matt Hall Borough Manager and Kevin Smith PE Borough Engineer have reviewed the bids and recommend that the award of contract be made to Top Line Construction Corp. in the amount of \$1,098.097.38 as the lowest responsible bidder; and

**WHEREAS,** Natasha Turchan Chief Finance Officer shall certify the availability of funds in the amount of \$1,098,097.38 from accounts:

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the Borough Council of the Borough of Washington authorizes the Qualified Purchasing Agent issue the appropriate purchase order in the amount of \$1,098.097.38 to Top Line Construction Corp.
