ORDINANCE 2019-27

ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$80,000.00 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE MASON DUMP TRUCK WITH THE SNOW PLOW AND

SPREADER IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON, IN THE COUNTY OF WARREN,

NEW JERSEY NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE

BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON, IN THE COUNTY OF WARREN, NEW JERSEY AS

FOLLOWS:

Section 1. \$80,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund of the

Borough of WASHINGTON, in the County of WARREN, New Jersey (the "Borough") for the purchase of

the mason dump truck with the snow plower and spreader, and further including all related costs and

expenditures incidental thereto.

Section 2. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary

capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to

conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent

that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a

revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect after final adoption and publication and

otherwise as provided by law.

VOUCHERS AND CLAIMS

COUNCIL REMARKS

Councilwoman Duchemin stated that Stigma Free will be at the Hometown Halloween.

Councilman France stated that this is last meeting and thanked everyone for their help and enjoyed being on council even though for a short period. Mr. France discussed his first meeting with Manager Hall and appreciated his time to explain things.

Councilman Norris thanked Councilwomen Conry and Duchemin in their work with for the senior citizens. Thanked France for showing up and being here. Thanked Ms. Theil in her work with the BID. Councilwoman Norris also stated that the Manager and Police are doing a great job.

Mayor Higgins reviewed correspondences receive by Union Township regarding street opening ordinances. The first annual pumpkin drop was discussed with details outlining the festival that the Fire Department is holding. The date is Sunday October 27th. The BID will hold in conjunction to the pumpkin drop a tribute to Abbey Road, the 50th anniversary of the famous picture with the Beatles. Mayor Higgins thanked France for the kind words.

On a personal note, Mayor Higgins discussed his grandson Jackson who was born blind, due to a genetic disease in which he underwent an experimental procedure. This procedure enabled him to gain his vision. Netflix is coming out with a new show which depicts Jackson's story that followed him and his family for months, this show will be available on Netflix this Friday.

Manager Hall reported on the upcoming paving projects throughout the borough.

Manager Hall discussed repealing the ordinance requiring yard sale permits. It was the consensus of Council to repeal the ordinance. Mayor Higgins asked that it be on the next meeting agenda.
