WASHINGTON BOROUGH COUNCIL MINUTES

May 05, 2020

The regular meeting of the Borough Council of Washington, Warren County, New Jersey was held via ZOOM live stream at 7:00 P.M.

Mayor Higgins led everyone in the flag salute.

Mayor Higgins read the following statement into record:

"The requirements of the Open Public Meetings Law, 1975, Chapter 231, have been satisfied in that adequate notice of this meeting has been published in the Star Gazette and posted on the bulletin board, borough website and Facebook stating the time, place and purpose of the meeting as required by law."

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mel Thiel, BID Executive Director, gave an update on the grant that the BID received. Applications are still being taken for vendors for the farmers market. Due to guidelines put out by the County Health Department, spaces for vendors will be reduced to 35 instead of 70. They will have two food trucks coming in. They are combining the Green and Arts Craft festivals into one festival. More information can be found on the BIDS website at washingtonbid.org

Hearing no further public comment, motion made by Noone and seconded by Conry to close the public portion, all were in favor.

RESOLUTIONS

Manager Hall started the discussions explaining Governor Murphy's executive order concerning a deadline extension for property taxes. Manager Hall explained his concern stating that

municipalities do not get the reprieve from paying the school and county taxes late.

CFO, Natasha briefed council on the current situation of taxes and how they are paid regarding

County and School obligations. She stated that the borough could go to May 15th without any

impact to the borough.

Mayor Higgins explained if the borough were to extend the grace period further they would have

to take out a tax anticipation note.

It was the consensus of Council to extend the deadline to May 15, 2020.

Motion made by Conry and seconded by Noone to approve Resolution 2020-77.

RESOLUTION NO. 2020 –77

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON,

COUNTY OF WARREN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, INSTITUTING A GRACE PERIOD CONCLUDING ON

May 15, 2020 FOR THE PAYMENT OF SECOND-

OUARTER PROPERTY TAXES.

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of New Jersey issued Executive Order 103 on

March 9, 2020, declaring a Public Health Emergency and a State of Emergency due to the

worldwide COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, said Public Health Emergency and State of Emergency continue to exist; and

WHEREAS, property taxpayers may be suffering from financial hardships as a result of

the COVID-19 pandemic, including but not limited to, loss or drop of income or unexpected

expenses due to necessary health care; and

WHEREAS, under N.J.S.A. 54:4-67(a), a municipality may fix the rate of interest to be charged for the nonpayment of taxes, assessments, or other municipal liens or charges, on or before the date when they would become delinquent, and may provide that no interest shall be charged if payment of any installment is made within the tenth calendar day following the date upon which the same became delinquent, thereby establishing a grace period running through May 11, 2020 for the second-quarter property taxes, as to the Borough of Washington's budget cycle; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 130 (2020) was issued on April 28, 2020, which authorized municipalities to establish a grace period extension no later than May 11, 2020 for payment of second-quarter property taxes and that any provisions of N.J.S.A. 54:4-66(a), N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.1(a) and N.J.S.A. 54:4-67(a) inconsistent with Executive Order 130 (2020) were suspended for the duration of the Public Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the governing body to adopt a resolution instituting a grace period of May 15, 2020 for the payment of second-quarter property taxes, to assist the property taxpayers of the Borough of Washington.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the Borough of Washington, County of Warren, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. That the governing body does hereby institute a grace period of May 15, 2020 for the payment of second-quarter property taxes for properties in the Borough, in accordance with the provisions of Executive Order 130 (2020).
- 2. That a certified copy of this Resolution shall be forwarded by the Municipal Clerk to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs within three (3) business days of the adoption of this Resolution.

3. That a certified copy of this Resolution shall be forwarded to the Tax Collector, Chief

Financial Officer, and the Township Manager.

MINUTES

Motion made by Conry and seconded by Noone to approve the minutes of April 21, 2020.

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Attorney St. Angelo gave the following update:

• Affordable Housing is moving towards a compliance hearing-it is on the calendar in front of Judge Miller. The property owner has come to an agreement with zoning. They are dropping their insistence of septic standards. A new zoning ordinance will be at the next meeting or soon thereafter for Council to review.

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Borough Clerk, Laurie Barton gave the following remarks:

• Discussed the latest executive order from Governor Murphy involving marriage applications; they can now be done virtually without coming in person.

Mayor Higgins gave the following remarks:
