WHEREAS, the Borough of Washington wishes to increase the purchase order with Veolia Water North American for fencing for security and safety at the vegetative waste storage facility for both the Wastewater Treatment Plant and the vegetative waste facility; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Washington enter into a contract with Veolia Water North America for the construction of the vegetative waste storage; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Washington was made aware of compliance requirements pursuant to **N.J.A.C. 7:14A-6.12** regarding security of Wastewater Treatment Plants for fencing; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Finance Officer will certify the availability of the funds from account 05-2020-56-502-2-28; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough of Washington of Warren County authorized the increase of the purchase order by \$45,732.50
