#### **ORDINANCE 2020-01**

ORDINANCE AMENDING ACCESSEE AND SIGN EASEMENTS OVER A PORTION OF PROPERTY OWNED BY THE BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON IDENTIFIED AS BLOCK 26, LOT 10

- **WHEREAS**, the Borough of Washington (the "Borough") is the owner of certain property identified as Block 26, Lot 10 on the Borough of Washington Tax Maps; and
- **WHEREAS,** Block 26, Lot 10 is a vacant strip of land along Route 31 that is not needed for any public purposes; and
- **WHEREAS**, Washington 31, LLC is under contract to purchase adjacent properties identified as Block 26, Lots 5, 6, 7, and 8 on the Borough of Washington Tax Maps; and
- **WHEREAS**, Washington 31, LLC has approvals from the Borough Land Use Board to merge and redevelop the afore-mentioned lots as a retail pharmacy; and
- **WHEREAS,** the afore-mentioned lots do not have frontage on Route 31, which Washington 31, LLC has advised is essential for the success of the proposed redevelopment; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Borough previously granted Washington 31, LLC an access easement over Block 26, Lot 10 permitting the construction of a driveway to access the proposed CVS Pharmacy pursuant to Ordinance 2019-08 adopted on April 16, 2019; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Borough previously granted Washington 31, LLC sign easement over Block 26, Lot 10 permitting the construction of a directional sign pursuant to Ordinance 2019-13 adopted on June 18, 2019; and
- **WHEREAS**, Washington 31, LLC has requested revisions to the aforementioned easements requiring the adoption of this ordinance; and
- **WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-1 permits the conveyance of an interest in land note needed for a public purpose; and
- **WHEREAS,** the public's interest in Block 26, Lot 10 is not affected by the granting of a sign easement; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Borough believes it is in the best interest of its residents to grant such easements because it furthers the purposes of the Downtown Redevelopment Plan and increases the value of Block 26, Lots 5, 6, 7, and 8, resulting in an increased tax assessment and tax revenue; and
- **NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Washington, County of Warren, State of New Jersey as follows:
- **SECTION 1**. The Borough of Washington is hereby authorized to enter into an access and sign easement over a portion of Block 26, Lot 10, owned by the Borough, in a form substantially similar to that attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- **SECTION 2**. The Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary for the conveyance of such easement.
- **SECTION 3**. The land subject to the proposed easement is not needed for public purpose and it is determined to be in the best interests of the Borough of Washington to permit such easement.
  - **SECTION 4**: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- **SECTION 5:** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.

**SECTION 6**: This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by Law.

**WHEREAS**, the State of New Jersey has appropriated \$10 million for Shared Services and School District Consolidation Study and Implementation Grants to assist local units with the study, development and implementation of new shared and regional services; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services (DLGS) is tasked with administering these grant funds through the Local Efficiency Achievement Program (LEAP); and

WHEREAS, LEAP Implementation Grants exist to support costs associated with shared service implementation to ensure that meaningful, efficiency generating initiatives are not hindered by short term transitional expenses; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Washington and Participating Local Units propose to enter into a shared services agreement, but face certain expenses associated with implementation that present a burden to the local units; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of this shared services agreement is to fully implement the Southern Warren County Regional Animal Control program which will benefit the residents of all local units participating in the agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Washington has agreed to be the lead agency in this program and will submit the application to DLGS on behalf of all participating units; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Borough of Washington that the Borough of Washington will apply for a LEAP Implementation Grant in the amount of \$250,000 to support implementation of this shared service.

#### RESOLUTION 2020-32 BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON APPLICANT'S RESOLUTION FOR LEAP CHALLENGE GRANT

**WHEREAS**, the State of New Jersey has allocated \$150,000 within each county for a statewide total of \$3.15 million in Local Efficiency Achievement Program (LEAP) funds to promote innovation among peer local units across New Jersey, and

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services (DLGS) administers the LEAP grant program; and

**WHEREAS**, the LEAP Challenge Grant exists to challenge municipalities and counties to collaborate on more extensive partnership and collaborations to produce efficiencies through shared services; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Washington and the municipalities currently participating in the shared service agreement for the Southern Warren County Regional Animal Control program have determined to apply for a LEAP Challenge Grant through the State of New Jersey Local Efficiency Achievement Program in the amount of \$70,000; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Washington has agreed to be the lead agency in this program; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body of the Borough of Washington is acknowledging and accepting the responsibility of acting as applicant and administrator for this grant on behalf of all participating local units.

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has made LEAP grants available to assist local units to study, develop and implement new shared services initiatives; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of the project submitted in this grant application is intended to provide benefits to the participant local units' residents through the sharing of Animal Control Services;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Governing Body of the Borough of Washington that the Borough of Washington does hereby make application for a LEAP challenge grant to support undertaking this endeavor.

### RESOLUTION 2020-33 BOROUGH OF WASHINGTON RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR THE CELEBRATION OF THE $100^{\mathrm{TH}}$ ANNIVERSARY OF WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE

**WHEREAS**, the year 2020 marks the 100th anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution, guaranteeing and protecting women's right to vote; and

**WHEREAS**, this centennial offers an opportunity to commemorate a milestone of democracy; that the right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the federal or state governments on account of gender; and

**WHEREAS**, New Jersey has had a long, storied history in the suffrage movement with New Jersey women playing a crucial role in pursing the rights of women to vote; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1776 women property owners were enfranchised under the New Jersey State Constitution, which was unique in the nation at the time. However, in 1807, the New Jersey Legislature eliminated the property requirement for voting rights and limited the ballot to white males; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1867 New Jersey residents Lucy Stone and Harry Blackwell organized the New Jersey Woman Suffrage Association (NJWSA), devoted to gaining women's suffrage; and

WHEREAS, in 1909 New Jersey's first open air suffrage rallies were held in Orange and Newark, led by Dr. Emma O. Gantz and Martha Klatshchken with NJWSA collecting 5,000 signatures for a petition in support of the federal amendment guaranteeing and protecting women's constitutional right to vote; and

**WHEREAS**, although the 1912 state referendum on woman's suffrage was soundly defeated in the New Jersey Legislature a corner was turned for the New Jersey suffrage movement; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1913 an automobile rally led by "General" Rosalie Jones traveled through New Jersey on the way to Washington, D.C., in a Suffrage Parade of over 8,000 marchers with many New Jersey women including event organizer Alice Paul; and

WHEREAS, in 1915 a second suffrage constitutional referendum was pursued in New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, and Massachusetts with active campaigns by many suffrage organizations, including the "Passing of the Torch of Liberty" via tug boats on the Hudson River from New York to New Jersey, but was defeated in all four states October 1915; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1917 New Jersey suffragists Allison Turnbull Hopkins, Julia Hulburt, Beatrice Reynolds Kinkead, and Minnie D. Abbott picketed in front of the White House as part of the Silent Sentinels and subsequently were arrested and imprisoned; and

 $\mathbf{WHEREAS},$  on June 4, 1919 Congress passed the 19th Amendment guaranteeing all American women the right to vote; and

**WHEREAS**, on February 9, 1920, New Jersey became the 29th state to ratify the 19th Amendment granting women the right to vote; and

**WHEREAS**, shortly after the ratification of the 19th Amendment Margaret Laird and Jennie Van Ness were the first two women elected to the New Jersey Assembly in 1921 and in 1925 Rebecca Estelle Bourgeois Winston of Estell Manor was New Jersey's first woman mayor;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Borough of Washington supports the efforts of New Jersey's Suffrage Centennial NJ Women Vote and strongly encourages local celebrations of this historic milestone; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Governor, Secretary of State and New Jersey League of Municipalities.
