Special Meeting and Public input:

New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act” (Bill No. S21) also known as the “Recreational Cannabis Law” Pursuant to Section 31(b) of the Recreational Cannabis Law, “a municipality may prohibit the operation of any one or more classes of cannabis establishment or cannabis distributors...” A municipality must enact such an ordinance within 180 days of the “effective date” of the law. Any ordinance enacted prior to the “effective date” of the law will be null and void. However, a municipality cannot prohibit cannabis delivery services from operating within the municipality (i.e. a municipality cannot prohibit delivery services from delivering within or passing through the municipality). If the municipality fails to opt-out via ordinance within 180 days, the municipality is barred from enacting such an ordinance for a period of five years. During that five-year period, dispensaries will be permitted in all retail / business zones as a conditional use and manufacturing and cultivating uses will be permitted in industrial zones.
