

Recreation Director Report

March 23rd 2017

- Speed Bump- Discussed with Matt, one speed bump is fine next to the shed where the dumpster's fence creates a blind spot for drivers, where kids cross to go to the pool or basketball court.
- Changes to Fee Schedule was given to counsel with reasons for changes. And the fee ordinance has been passed.
- Electrical bonding for pool- These prices are assuming all of the electrical testing passes, and no additional work needs to be done.
 - John Dorsch- \$1,260.00
 - Premier Electric- \$750.00
 - Chief Electric- \$1,400.00
- Softball
 - Equipment- I've been going through equipment. So far softballs have been ordered.
 - Went through the jerseys. We have more than enough.
 - Pants & Visors- Susan recently found on the new Morris County Co-Op catalog their pants and visors were significantly cheaper than we found in previous vendors. Pants have been ordered.
 - Chalk Liner- Arrived, assembled, and ready to use for the upcoming season.
 - This is a win-win. Field will be much easier for maintenance to line, and look much more professional than using paint.
- DPW Serviced 3 wheeler, and mowers.
 - After the DPW struggled to get the 3 wheeler up the ramp to haul it to the DPW building, we discussed a need for a John Deer Gator.
 - The 3 wheeler is on it last leg. We use it for grooming Boro field's infield, as well as put a wagon on it whenever something heavy needs to be pulled around the park such as equipment, mulch, and branches directly after the storm last year.
 - To receive the needed funds for a gator we can sell the water wheel. According to one of the DPW workers the water wheel was necessary for when they first put the sod on Vara. It has not been used since. The machine sits in the shed by Steinhardt depreciating every year.

- Clay for Steinhardt- Steinhardt's clay is hard as a rock.
 - \$40 per ton for clay. Need 15 tons. Total \$600
 - ACF will spread it= \$400
 - I believe since we do not have a machine at Steinhardt that digs into the clay like the 3 wheeler does at boro, the clay at Steinhardt gets packed down creating it to become so hard.

- Brought Matt Lopez our Fire Inspector to look at the hoses down at the pool- the thread on the hoses we received is does not fit the fitting on the well. He may be able to get us a hose.

- New pool speakers came in.

- Starting next week I'll be taking lifeguarding classes.

- Began advertising for summer recreation employment.
