

## Recreation Director Report March 29 – April 11, 2018

Easter Egg Hunt held on March 24 with approximately 300- 350 children and their parents showing up on a beautiful day at the Borough Park. Very rewarding to see a lot of children with smiles on their faces.

Did Chemical inventory at park with DPW in preparation for PCA Recycling day for disposal of chemicals and old paints.

Girls Youth Softball practice started week of April 1<sup>st</sup> with tentative opening day at park on April 21<sup>st</sup>.

Started doing daily field grooming (weather permitting) with Workman and Rand Groomer.

April 9<sup>th</sup> removed cover from pool and started draining water in preparation for spring preparation.

April 9<sup>th</sup> moved all Hockey equipment to coaches closet for summer storage.

April 10<sup>th</sup> Initial field grooming of Steinhart field completed with Rand Groomer.

April 10<sup>th</sup> DPW delivered 3 tons of mound clay from Partac to Steinhart field. \$327.00 cost to be reimbursed to Recreation by Little league.

April 11<sup>th</sup> DPW delivered 15 tons of Premium Medium infield clay to Steinhart field from Partac Peat. \$983.00 cost to be reimbursed to Recreation by Little League.

Talked to Memorial School Administrator about possible use of Taylor Street School field location to build 1 or 2 Baseball/Softball fields for use by Ponytail Level Softball/ Little League Tee Ball for games and practice. Administrations initial response was very positive. This would accommodate approximately 25% of field requirements for existing Youth Baseball and Softball programs.

Received check from Physical Therapy + for sponsorship of Ponytail Youth softball team. Money goes to print T-Shirts.
